Every three years, Mountain Projects conducts a **Community Needs Assessment** that helps refine our program strategy and fine-tunes our efforts **to meet the most pressing needs** of our community.

As you know, our programs provide a coordinated effort to address the root effects of poverty and, ultimately, move families and individuals to self-sufficiency. Poverty is a systemic problem and our agency uses a systems approach to resolving these issues.

Currently, two pressing issues stand out in our results: affordable housing for low-income workers and affordable childcare for both single and double parent households.

Wages aren't keeping up and many aren't making enough at work to make ends meet. Mountain Projects is working to overcome these challenges by making Head Start accessible to more families and we are in the ongoing process of building affordable housing with increased staffing, new land and pre-qualified homeowners.

As always, handouts aren't the focus of what we do, instead **we empower individuals** to stabilize and improve their lives. Your support helps us do this **and strengthens the social and economic fabric** of western North Carolina.
